CALL FOR PAPERS – PAPERS & POSTERS

The Adirondack Research Consortium invites researchers of national, regional, and local expertise to present their latest scientific research at the 28th Annual Conference on the Adirondacks at the Lake Placid Conference Center, Lake Placid, NY, on May 16th & 17th, 2024.

This is an invitation to submit an abstract of a **paper** to be presented at the conference. Individuals may also choose to submit an abstract for a **poster** to be displayed throughout the proceedings which will include an opportunity to meet other conference attendees to discuss it at a Poster Reception held during lunch on May 16th, 2024. If your paper is not accepted, you are invited to present a poster.

The 2024 Annual Conference theme is *"Emerging Pressures Caused by Climate Change"*. At the Annual Conference as we delve into the pressing issue of climate change in the Adirondacks. Explore how rising temperatures are reshaping ecosystems, endangering native flora and fauna, and threatening local communities and culture. The Conference will also include traditional presentations on natural resources and the Adirondack community. Presenters are encouraged to present research conclusions initially followed by limited slides supporting that conclusion and providing time for audience discussion.

You can find an **abstract submission form** at www. adkresearch.org or by contacting the Consortium directly. Electronic submissions are preferred. The submission deadline is April 30th, 2024. Decisions on paper presentations will be made within two-weeks of receipt. If a paper is not selected for presentation the author is invited to present a poster. Participants are asked to register for the conference.

We are also inviting researchers to consider submitting their research for publication in the Adirondack Journal of Environmental Studies (AJES). AJES is now accepting submissions for Volume 27. We welcome articles of a broad disciplinary or interdisciplinary scope including topics in natural and social sciences, arts and humanities related to the region, or of more general environmental interest.
